We chose Justice Sandra Day O'Connor as our topic because her role in history connected to an aspect of all our interests. She is the first female on the Supreme Court of the United States, which governs our nation, and in turn, influences us in our day-to-day lives. We began our research by learning about Justice O'Connor's childhood and early adult life.
